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

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












### The "dibber"



### **Dibber**

#### Noun

A hand tool with a pointed end; used to make holes in the ground for planting seeds or bulbs.

#### Danish:

priklepind, plantepind

#### Dutch:

verspeenhoutje, pootstok, plantstok, plantboor

#### Finnish:

istutuspuikko

#### French:

travelle, repiquer, plantechapon, pic, pal, haque, broche, birone, bâton semoir

#### German:

Steckeisen, Setzeisen, Pikierstab, Pikierholz, Pflanzholz, Pflanzeisen

#### Greek:

### Diagnostic test

- What people know
  - Pitch content at right level
- Whether students are following you
  - Explain further or move on
- What people feel
  - Deal with hostility
  - Discover what is important to them
  - Capture their imagination

### Why am I asking this question? (3)




What do we mean by a "95% confidence interval"?

Would an 80% CI be wider or narrower?


Reinforcement/layering

### Socratic questioning

A kind of questioning in which an original question is responded to as though it were an answer forcing the first questioner to reformulate a new question in light of the progress of the discourse.

# Questions help maximise opportunity for everyone to have a say



### Risks?

- Have own ignorance revealed
- Get blown off course
- Lose control of session
- (Not as efficient)

### Role of questions

- Intimidate
- Show off
- Disconcert
- **Diagnose** (learning needs)
- Engage people
- Make learning sticky
- Deepen understanding
- Build on expertise of group

- Amuse
- Gain attention
- To help lay out an argument
- Change dynamics
- Learn yourself
- Buy time
- Rehearse/practice
- Model reflective practice
